



Course number and title	Y302 French II with Madame Goeller
Course description (paragraph)	In French 2, students will expand on the skills they gathered in French 1 and take important steps towards proficiency in reading, writing, listening, and speaking. Students will learn for the first time how to describe past events in detail, begin to use more complex grammatical structures, and broaden existing vocabularies with units about food, entertainment, and other topics.

Units taught (chronological sequence appropriate)	Rappel- Review of French 1 Unité 1- Vocab (family, nationalities, occupations, <i>être/avoir/faire/aller</i> expressions, adjectives) Grammar (irregular adjectives, irregular verbs) Unité 2- Vocab (activities, animals/nature), Grammar (passé composé, negatives) Unité 3- Vocab (food, quantities) Grammar (partitive, stem-changing verbs) Unité 4- Vocab (entertainment) Grammar (direct/indirect object pronouns, <i>savoir vs. connaître</i>) Unité 5- Vocab (sports, body parts) Grammar (reflexive verbs, <i>y, en</i>) Unité 6- Vocab (home and city) Grammar (imperfect past tense, relative pronouns)
Major exams/projects; (keep syllabus up to date)	Each unit is comprised of four lessons. Each lesson will have a quiz worth 25-40 points. Projects include: - Quarterly Journals - French Recipe - Children's book using past tense - Dialogues- written and spoken The final exam consists of two parts: a speaking/writing portion, and a multiple-choice portion.
Grading practice/policy	Students in French II will be graded using a total points system. Students will earn points by completing homework, in-class assignments, quizzes, tests and projects. It is very important for students to complete assignments on time, as many assignments tend to build on the previous assignments. Projects and assignments will be accepted late for credit.
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
