1. The latitude and longitude lines are drawn at 10° intervals. Label these on the west and north sides of the map.
2. With blue pencils, color the bodies of water light blue, and label the following in darker blue:  
Mediterranean Sea, Red Sea, Caspian Sea, Black Sea, Aegean Sea, Adriatic Sea, Atlantic Ocean, North Sea
3. With a blue pencil trace the following rivers and label them:  
Tiber, Nile, Tigris, Euphrates, Po, Rhine, Danube, Rubicon
4. Label the following islands:  
Corsica, Sardinia, Balearic Islands, Sicily, Crete, Cyprus, Britain
5. With a brown pencil, use lines of “^s” to indicate mountain ranges, and label the following:  
Pyrenees, Alps, Caucasus Mountains
6. With a green pencil, label the following areas:
